People of Messiah:

I've been thinking about the word "integration" for the past few weeks. My ponderings center on the individual's practice of spiritual integration, not the corporate integration we tend to associate with great movements like public school **integration** in the 1960s. As I learn more about myself, I've come to realize that I'm at home in my head (thinking, dreaming, reflecting), but I struggle at moving my thoughts to action. Simply put, I may know what needs to be done, but I may not know when and where to start the "doing" and how to keep it going after I've started. Integration is a challenge for me. What about you?

The Letter to James offers disciples a twofold invitation: Listen and do. As we receive good news from God, God invites us to let the word transform our lives and reconfigure our priorities. Imagine if the disciples said, "That was unexpected!" on Easter morning, but then went back to business as usual. Does Easter matter? Instead, the Good News of Resurrection becomes a springboard for prophecy, healing, evangelism, prayer, forgiveness, and the establishment of the Church. The disciples integrate Good News into good spiritual practice.

In the upcoming months, I will ask you to think about ways you can integrate our congregational strategic plan – Let Your Light Shine – into your individual spiritual practice. The Plan, rooted in Acts 2, invites us deepen our commitment to discipleship. For now, I'm focused on Goal Three:

Messiah aspires to be a GENEROUS congregation of God's people, called and equipped to share God's gifts throughout the community.

What does this look like for you? Or, as I asked at worship two Sundays ago, how are we practicing the invitation to Go in peace and serve the Lord?

I look forward to hearing from you.

WEDNESDAY SPEAKER SERIES - OCTOBER

Philosopher Ludwig Feuerbach suggested in the mid-19thcentury that, in contrast to the Bible's assertion that we are made in the image of God, instead "man has created God in his own image."

In what ways might this be true? Are we careful to distinguish *God* from our descriptions of God? Do narrow or exclusive images of God keep us from living out the gospel as fully as we could? How might expanding our images of God enrich our faith and our witness?

During Wednesdays in October, Krista Hughes will invite us to consider these questions by taking us on a tour of theological movements that have emerged in the last 50 years in response to shifting cultural landscapes and the call to live out the gospel in fresh ways.


